It was such a happy and memorable occasion celebrating Mavis' 100th birthday hosted by her daughters Gillian and Rosemary and their families. Mavis was on wonderful form and enjoyed seeing her many friends. There was a marvellous album of photographs of her cruise in 2007 when she crossed the Arctic Circle. Mavis and Desmond (late husband and Churchwarden in the 1970s) were at the heart of GSM for many decades and contributed greatly to the life and ministry of GSM. In the 1990s she played Queen Elizabeth I in a pageant at GSM, as part of a very successful career in drama. Mavis continues to be a valued member of 'Something Understood' the GSM poetry group.




Sat 4 Oct - Icons Exhibition opens

About the exhibition

Icons on Ammunition Boxes is a conceptual project by Ukrainian artists Sofiia Atlantova and Oleksandr Klymenko launched in 2014. The icons are painted on fragments from ammunition boxes from the war zones in Ukraine and serve as silent war witnesses as well as symbols of the victory of life over death.

About the artists

SOFIIA ATLANTOVA (born on Dec. 14,1981, lives & works in Kyiv, Ukraine) Graduate of the National Academy of Fine Arts and Architecture. Works in the field of monumental and easel painting, book graphics, installations. Participated in exhibitions in Ukraine and abroad. Her books were included in short and long lists of several literary awards in Ukraine and abroad, in particular -"BBC Book of the Year".

OLEKSANDR KLYMENKO (born on July 5, 1976, lives & works in Kyiv, Ukraine) Graduate of the National Academy of Fine Arts and Architecture, Institute of Art History, Folklore and Ethnology and National Academy of Sciences of Ukraine. Taught at the Kyiv State Institute of Decorative Arts and Design and at the Higher Humanitarian Theological Courses (Kyiv). Participated in exhibitions in Ukraine and abroad, organized of a number of literary and artistic events and performances. Author of the idea and one of the curators of the Icons on Ammunition Boxes.





Park Street School Foundation Governors required

Park Street CoE Primary School, to give it its full name, has a long association with Great St Mary's. It is rather like a village school - just 115 pupils - but situated in the city centre. It is a church school which means that several of the governors are 'foundation governors', nominated either by the diocese or by Church Schools of Cambridge. We ensure that the school retains its Christian ethos, and under the current Head, this has been blossoming. Meetings are only twice a term but governors are encouraged to get involved with an individual class and with one other area which can range from safeguarding to health and safety to curriculum development. Currently we are especially in need of one person with financial acumen plus 'one other' If this is something you


might consider and would like to learn more about what is involved, do contact me for further information. I have just been persuaded to renew my term of office because it is very rewarding.

Charity Christmas Cards



Once again 'religious-themed' Christmas cards will be on sale at coffee in Michaelhouse after the 10am service. This means that it is easy to buy two or four packs for a fiver or tenner. Cash only, I'm afraid.

What will we be supporting this time? With the blessing of the Wider Concerns Committee we shall contribute to 'Away From It All' Holidays. This provides holidays for Cambridgeshire families - recommended by

family workers, clergy and teachers - who they feel would benefit from an experience that they could not otherwise afford. They stay in static caravans in Hunstanton and enjoy lots of activities, with pocket money supplied to the children and funding towards food and travel. For many children it is the first time they have ever been on holiday. We usually manage to raise about £150, once the cards have been paid for. Any extra donations also welcome.
