

From the Vicar: Advent: making room for Christ



We are getting close to the season of Advent, starting on Sunday 30 November, comprising the four Sundays before Christmas. It is a very special, holy time inviting us to prepare for Christmas by making some space in our lives and hearts for the birth of the child, who came into the world, mostly unnoticed, to bring us the immensity of peace, mercy, joy and hope that are God.

The four weeks leading up to Christmas are, of course, for many of us extremely busy with preparations for Christmas in addition to our usual full schedules. For some, it is a challenging time of year, because it increases a sense of isolation or brings difficult memories to the fore. The bible readings in Advent connect with the reality and struggles of human existence and offer nourishment and hope. Advent is a time for prayer and reflection, for longing and waiting, trusting that God is at work and with us.

There are many ways to mark this special season, to create space for reflection and prayer. I grew up with the tradition of having an advent wreath with four

candles on our dining table. We would light the candle(s) at every meal, and as each week another candle was lit, the sense of anticipation of Christmas grew. The Christmas tree wasn't put up until a few days before Christmas.

At Great St Mary's the Advent Procession 'From darkness to light', a service of readings, music and antiphons on the first Sunday of Advent at 4pm, is a wonderful way to mark the beginning of this holy season. On the three Wednesdays evenings in Advent, Clare is offering 'Advent Compline at Home', a 30-minute service on ZOOM, which includes a reflection, 10 minutes silence and the very soothing words of 'Compline', an ancient form of night prayer. More information and the ZOOM link are in this eMag. Rosie, our children's and youth minister will be offering suggestions for marking Advent at home with children and young people on the

The gift of Advent is the invitation to be more deeply in touch with ourselves and with God. A simple way of doing this is to stop and be still; to be, in the presence of God, just to be and let God love you. The clergy would like to invite us to spend 10 minutes, each day in Advent being still, silent, at a time of day that suits – one may choose the same time each day; or think about the day ahead, when it would be most helpful to stop for 10 minutes in the presence of God; it's a lovely way to start of the day, or stop in the middle of the day, or at home with a cuppa. Spending just 10 minutes a day, intentionally in the presence of God in this busy time of year will be honoured by God who is more generous than we could ever ask or imagine. Our advent book suggestion this year is 'Donkey Roads and Camel Treks' by Gemma Simmonds, a book with the daily lectionary bible reading for Advent and Christmas, followed by a reflection, questions for pondering and a prayer, suitable for individual and group reading. As the title suggests, it's down to earth, pastoral, tender, full of wisdom and insight - an excellent companion on our journey to Christmas. There will be some copies in the GSM book shop to buy, and it's available online.

Many of us are longing for more peace, joy and light in our lives and our world. My prayer for us all is, that in this holy season, we can make a bit of space for God and receive the great gift of peace, joy, mercy and hope that are God at Christmas.

I wish you a very blessed Advent.





#### **Baptism and Confirmation at Great St. Mary's**

We are delighted that we have two Sunday Eucharists with baptisms coming up in the next few months at Great St Mary's, with one adult and three children preparing to be baptized. If you have been thinking about baptism for you or your child, please, let us know as you will be most welcome to join these four in being baptized at these services.

The dates of the forthcoming baptism services are Sunday 7 December (10am Choral Eucharist Service) and Sunday 1 February (10am All Together Choral Eucharist). Adults who are baptized also prepare for confirmation, and we are hoping to have a confirmation service here at Great St Mary's in May or June 2026 (date to be confirmed). We invite older children (from year 7 onwards) to think about confirmation and join preparation sessions.

Baptism is both a sign and a sacrament (an act through which Christians believe there is an effective spiritual change) of commitment to the Christian faith. If the baptism candidate is a child, the



commitment extends to the prayerful oversight of their parents or carers and godparents. Baptism is when the worshipping community welcomes the person being baptized into the family of the church.

Confirmation is a service during which people who were baptized as a child can make an affirmation of faith for themselves, and this affirmation is confirmed (blessed) by the bishop. At GSM we offer preparation sessions for those who are considering confirmation which are intended to be an opportunity to explore your faith with others. These will take place during the 2026 Lent term.

If you are considering baptism or confirmation for yourself or your child, then please do contact Jutta, Ally, Clare or Rosie (<u>clergy@gsm.cam.ac.uk</u>) to learn more about what this involves and how we can support you/them in terms of preparation.

#### **Great St Mary's Godparents**

All children who are baptized require 2-3 godparents who have been baptized (in any Christian church of any denomination) and who are prepared to commit to praying for that child as they grow up. Over time, godparents might end up being closely connected with their godchildren in terms of this prayerful oversight which very often becomes a source of mutual joy between godparent and godchild. There is no expectation that godparents have any other responsibility for the child such as financial support or guardianship.

If you sense a calling to take on the role of godparent and would be open to be a godparent of a child in the GSM community, do please discuss this with one of the clergy.





#### **Charity Christmas Cards**



Once again 'religious-themed' Christmas cards will be on sale at coffee in Michaelhouse after the 10am service. This will be from now until 14 December - or for as long as stocks last. The price remains the same as last year: 5 for £2.50. This means that it is easy to buy two or four packs for a fiver or tenner. Cash only, I'm afraid.

What will we be supporting this time? With the blessing of the Wider Concerns Committee we shall contribute to 'Away From It All' Holidays. This provides holidays for Cambridgeshire families - recommended by family workers, clergy and teachers - who they feel would benefit from an experience that they could not otherwise afford. They stay in static

caravans in Hunstanton and enjoy lots of activities, with pocket money supplied to the children and funding towards food and travel. For many children it is the first time they have ever been on holiday.

We usually manage to raise about £150, once the cards have been paid for. Any extra donations also welcome. Thank you in advance for your support.

#### **Last Requests and Funeral Planning**

On 8 November, in Michaelhouse, the GSM Pastoral Care Group hosted a thought provoking and practical workshop on planning for the end of life, the third session in the series of Pastoral Care Talks. While this might seem like a difficult topic, the session—led by Marie Brown, Margaret Johnston, Sonja Lafferty, and Ally Barrett—was filled with compassion, wisdom, and encouragement. The message was clear: planning ahead is a caring and creative act, both for ourselves and for those we love. By thinking ahead, we can make sure our wishes are known, our affairs are in order, and our loved ones are supported. We can plan a funeral service which both will help our loved ones in the grieving process and will leave them with lifelong good memories. It's about leaving behind peace of mind, not just paperwork.

#### **Legal Planning: Wills and Powers of Attorney**

Marie Brown, an estate planning consultant, spoke about the importance of making a Lasting Power of Attorney (LPA) and a will. An LPA allows you to appoint trusted people—called Powers of Attorney (PoAs)—to make decisions on your behalf if you're ever unable to do so. There are two types: one for Property and Finance, and one for Health and Welfare. Marie recommends starting this process early, as registration can take up to six months. You can apply online via the Office of the Public Guardian, or seek help from a legal adviser to make things easier.

A professionally written will ensures your estate is distributed as you wish and helps avoid disputes. You can also leave letters of final wishes attached to your will. With the support of your medical team, you can include with these an Advance Statement (your preferences for care), and an Advance Directive (a legal document which allows you to

refuse specific medical treatments).

Marie also reminded us to leave clear instructions about important documents, account details, passwords for accounts and devices, and even social media access—these seemingly small things can make a huge difference to those who will be charged to deal with your estate. It is important of course to let those who need to know the most (your executors, next of kin, medical team) know where they can find all these documents.

#### **Leaving a Legacy**

Margaret Johnston, our churchwarden, spoke about the impact of leaving a legacy to charity. Gifts to charities are not subject to inheritance tax and can support future generations. Many of the improvements in GSM we enjoy today—like the renovated West End—are thanks to generous past benefactors. Please consider early in the process of writing your will whether you might want to make a legacy, something which will benefit others for generations to come.



#### **Planning Your Funeral**

Sonja Lafferty, Assistant Funeral Manager at Peasgood and Skeates, encouraged us to think about our funeral wishes ahead of time. Choosing a funeral director in advance can help ease anxiety and ensure your wishes are respected. A good funeral director will be willing to talk to you about what will happen to you after death and before the funeral, and show you "behind the scenes". She has found this can very much help those who are close to death to release fear of the unknown related to what might happen immediately after they

Sonja cautioned against direct cremations without proper understanding. While they may seem a kind option for your loved ones, not having a funeral loses an important opportunity for helping their grief process. A good funeral director can offer respectful care and help families create a meaningful farewell, even with a simple ceremony.



Ally Barrett, Associate Vicar at GSM and St Michael's, shared her experience of supporting families through funerals. She emphasized how comforting and creative it can be to talk about funeral plans early. GSM has a funeral planning checklist available on request, which can help you think through your preferences—from music and readings to burial or cremation.

If you'd like your funeral to be held at GSM, your wishes can be stored securely with us. Ally also reminded us how the clergy team are available to support people spiritually when death is close, through prayer,

confession and sacrament, including the "last rites". Prayer for someone who has just died and those they love is very appropriate, and all the clergy would be prepared to visit at short notice for any of these reasons.


